# Criteria concerning termination of student status for students ID 66 or greater according to CMU Regulations on Undergraduate Study, B.E. 2566 (2023)

- Students who have doubled the length of study specified in the curriculum but have not graduated will lose their student status, counting from the first semester in which they were enrolled as students to the end of the <u>Summer Session</u> of the final year.
- For students who transferred from other institutions, the study duration starts from the first semester that they registered as students at the previous institutions.
- According to the 2023 Regulations, leaves of absence do not count toward the length of study. However, the length of the leave of absence may not exceed one-half of the length of study specified in the curriculum.

#### \*Remarks\*

- This regulation is enforced on Chiang Mai University's undergraduate programs which operate under the 2015 and 2022 standard criteria of curriculum, from the Academic Year 2023 onwards.
- This regulation is <u>not</u> enforced on students who attend Chiang Mai University for a Doctor of Medicine degree, Doctor of Dentistry degree, Doctor of Pharmacy degree, Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree, Bachelor of Medical Science degree, and Bachelor of Veterinary Science degree; as well as students who attend Chiang Mai University before the Academic Year 2023.

# Q: Can <u>excess registered courses</u> be assigned as free electives?

A: Yes in some cases, depending on the types of courses as follows:

- 1.**GE Courses:** Yes, for non-compulsory courses beyond the credit requirements stated in the curriculum.
- 2. Core courses: Yes, for some curricula which allow the conversion of excess courses to free electives (enquire from the department responsible for the course)
- 3. Minor courses: check specific conditions at https://www.eqd.cmu. ac.th/CD2022/minor.html

# Q: What to do if the student is expecting to graduate, but still in debt to the COVID-19 aid fund?
